The real estate program at San Diego State University was launched in 1958. It was the first university in the California University system and the second public university in the state of California to initiate a real estate program. In 2004, the McMillin family seeded the program with \$1.5 million to launch new education and research initiatives. The mission of The Corky McMillin Center for Real Estate is to improve real estate education and research at SDSU and create a bridge to the real estate industry and the San Diego community to foster interaction between students, faculty and industry participants. The Corky McMillin Center for Real Estate

plans to become a leading real estate education and market research center in the country. The Corky McMillin Companies was founded in 1960 by Corky McMillin, Founder and Visionary. Starting as a remodeling and custom-home builder, the company now has grown into a fully integrated real estate investment, land development, entitlement, realty, mortgage, and home-building company and in recent years expanded its operations outside the San Diego area. The company has built 30,000 residences, 16 mixed-use master-planned communities, more than 20 community parks, thousands of miles of new roads, schools, shopping centers, commercial office and industrial parks, college dormitories and 2,000 military residences on seven bases.
